Kidneys are important organs as they:

- Filter blood
- Remove waste products
- Regulate your body's balance of salt and water

What are the risk factors for developing CKD?



Things we CANNOT change:

- Family history
- Ethnicity (e.g., African American, Mexican, and Pima Indian)

Things we CAN change:

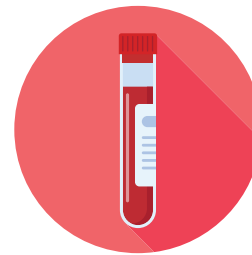
- High blood glucose
- High blood pressure
- High cholesterol
- Smoking
- Overweight or obesity

Will I have symptoms?
Most people with CKD will not have any symptoms.

How will my health care professional diagnose CKD?



Checking for protein in your urine (UACR)



Blood test (eGFR)

Possible further testing may be needed

Prevent CKD by:

- Manage blood glucose
- Manage blood pressure
- Making healthy lifestyle choices
